Foster Kids & Teens: New toys for the little ones, gifts cards or other nice gifts for teens.

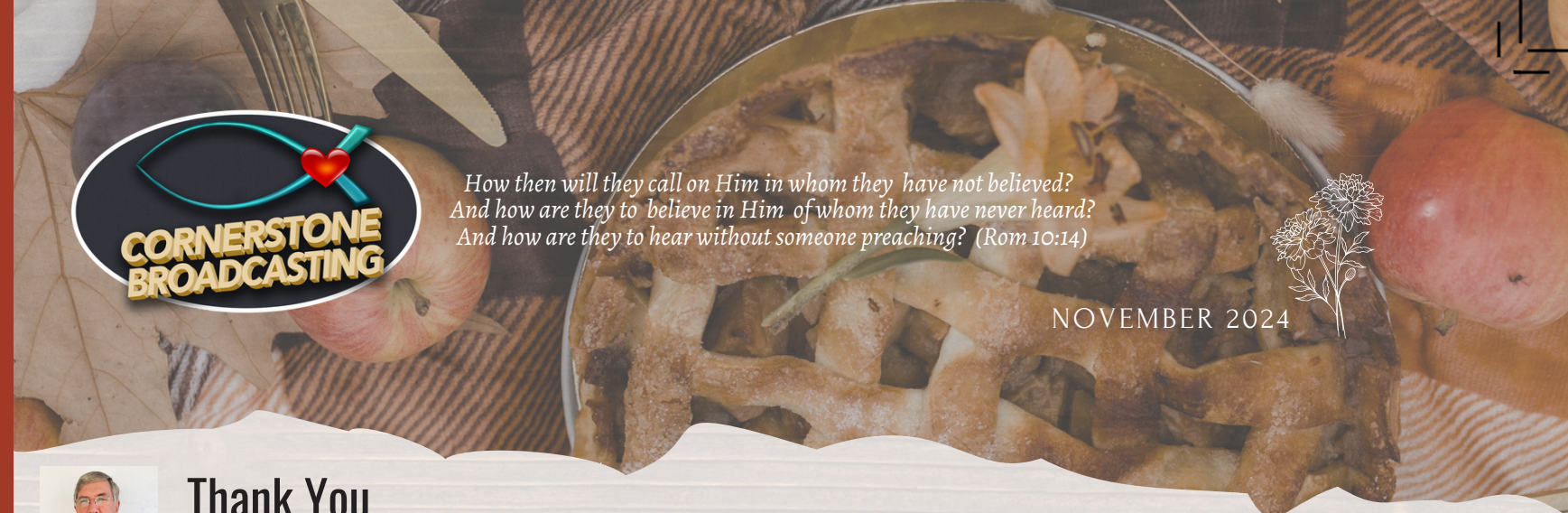
Homeless: New or *clean used blankets, new socks, and other personal hygiene items.

As for the Cornerstone, we are back except Deltona 102.7. The flooding at the location of our transmitter site was almost beyond belief. When we can get caught up, we will post some photos on our history page. All the homes in the site's neighborhood had significant flooding and water damage. Please pray for the folks in and around East High Banks Road in Debary. We were blessed in many ways. In New Smyrna the neighborhood where our transmitter site is also had severe flooding. The water was chest-deep. Our preparation spared us from flooding our transmitter but it took days before we could get to the site because of the high water. Once we got there, we were able to run on the generator until the power was restored. We were able to get the WMFJ 1450 back on the air the next day but had repeated problems with the generator shutting off. It took 5 days to get the power back on. Praise God our preparation kept us from flood damage.

Our studios held up well and even though we were without power for 4 days our generator kept us going. We did have one of our air conditioners fail from flood damage but were able to get it fixed the next day. I guess it goes without saying that debris created quite a mess. I am so thankful to know the Lord and be able to rest in His sovereign grace.

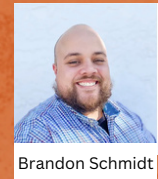

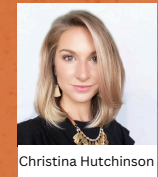
