When I was in high school, I was part of a Christian tour band. That tour band would practice for several months and then "tour" around the southeast performing shows for Christian high schools, youth groups, and churches. During these performances we would play music, give devotions, and perform skits. One of my alltime favorite skits was called "Focus on God!" In that skit, a group of us student would gather together at the front of the stage, take two fingers of each hand near our eyes and chant, "Focus on God! Focus on God! Focus on God!" while pointing those fingers back and forth from our eyes to God. As the skit went on, the inevitable distractions would begin. For example, one person would start to say loudly, "Focus on me! Focus on me! Focus on me!" Then someone else would join in and begin to get people to say, "No, No, Focus on me! Focus on me! Focus on me!" Finally, someone would stop everyone and say, "NO NO NO! Guys, remember, FOCUS ON GOD!" Then the group would get back on track for only a few moments, but inevitably something else would pull the focus of the group. There were several more examples of distractions like money, clothes, food, girls/guys, and so on. The point of the skit was to show how easily we are distracted by the things of this world.

It reminds me of my favorite part of Pilgrim's Progress, Vanity Fair. In this section, Christian and Faithful enter into a town called Vanity Fair that has all the pleasures this world has to offer. In Vanity Fair, a person could buy lands, titles, jewels, kingdoms, and even people. We see this type of offer in our world today. A person can become distracted and drawn to the fading things of this world. They are distractions and keep us from focusing on God. I John 2:15-17 warns us, "Do not love the world or the things in the world. If anyone loves the world, the love of the Father is not in him. For all that is in the world—the desires of the flesh and the desires of the eyes and pride of life — is not from the Father but is from the world. And the world is passing away along with its desires, but whoever does the will of God abides forever."

This passage shows that the world and its pleasures are passing away. But those who do the will of God last forever! So, I pray that as you travel this world, believer, that you remember to Focus on God. (Col. 3:2; Mt. 6:33; Ps. 121:1-2; Heb. 3:1; 12:1-2) Continue to pray and seek Him all your days and you will be blessed!! Soli Deo Gloria.



English poet Elizabeth Barrett Browning is perhaps most famous for her Sonnet 43, "How do I Love Thee?" It's so famous that most people, even if they haven't read the poem, know the rest of the line, "Let me count the ways." The poem beautifully expresses Elizabeth's love toward her husband, Robert, both in feeling and in action. Action? Yes. Isn't love a feeling, like if you feel it, you feel it? So, how can love be an action? Well, can a person be angry or sad or happy at someone's command? That seems silly. In Mark Chapter 12, verse 30, Jesus quoted Moses' command to "love the Lord your God with all your heart, and with all your soul, and with all your mind, and with all your strength." The love Jesus mentioned here must be an action rather than a feeling, showing love toward God even when our feelings don't cooperate. And let's face it- sometimes we are experiencing difficulty, and our hearts and minds are more troubled than they are glad. Yet, we CAN do it! Lord, how will we love thee? Below are-let's count them- more than a few ways from another famous poet, King David. Note all the action words! Psalm 105:1-4 reads:

Give thanks to the Lord, call upon His name; make His deeds known among the peoples. Sing to Him, sing praises to Him; tell of all His wonders. Boast in His holy name; may the heart of those who seek the Lord be joyful. Seek the Lord and His strength; seek His face continually.



I was listening to the old hymn "I Surrender All" the other day, and I couldn't help but think that the song isn't very realistic. I mean, who can honestly sing to the Lord that they have surrendered all to Him? Unfortunately, we hold on to some things. We don't die to ourselves as we ought. Maybe we should sing, "Most (Or even just 'some'!) to Jesus I surrender/ Most to Him I freely give/ I will sometimes love and trust Him/In His presence, often live." It would certainly be more accurate to sing it this way!

And yet, Christ has called us to die - die to sin, die to ourselves, die to this world - that we may live in Him. "Whoever loses his life for My sake and the gospel's will save it," He told us in Mark 9:35 (LSB). I'm reminded of the words of Dietrich Bonhoeffer: "When Christ calls a man, he bids him come and die." Daily we must die to the flesh and our sin. Daily we must surrender to Christ and obey His Word. For while we have been made new in Christ, we still battle against our flesh. We must still, daily, surrender to Him. I pray that we will come to love our Lord more and more, ever growing in obedience and holiness, that we may be able to truly sing those beautiful words, "All to Thee, my blessed Savior, I surrender all."
