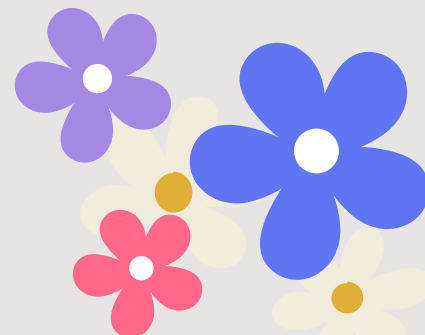

Let's be people who speak the truth.



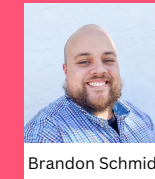
Our Creator, The Great Doctor

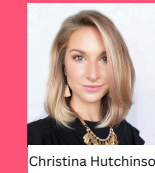
